COVID-19 Vaccination Policy

Scope

This policy applies to individuals who are currently vaccine-eligible under federal and provincial guidelines and who have an active role with The Queen City Yacht Club (“**QCYC**”), including but not limited to members, guests, contractors, volunteers, and staff, and who plan to **board a QCYC tender or to enter into any building on the QCYC grounds.**

Definitions

Accepted COVID-19 Vaccine - means a COVID-19 vaccine that has been approved for use by Health Canada or accepted under current Regulations and Ministry of Health guidance in Ontario.

Fully Vaccinated - means having received the completed series of an Accepted COVID-19 Vaccine. An individual is considered Fully Vaccinated 14 days after receiving their completed dose.

For greater certainty, a completed series of an Accepted COVID-19 Vaccine means:

- two doses in any combination of a COVID-19 vaccine authorized by Health Canada
- one or two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine not authorized by Health Canada followed by one dose of a COVID-19 mRNA vaccine authorized by Health Canada
- three doses of a COVID-19 vaccine not authorized by Health Canada

Policy

QCYC will require that all individuals eligible for vaccination be Fully Vaccinated as a condition of boarding a QCYC tender or entering any building on the QCYC grounds.

Activities, as well as this policy, will continue to be subject to federal, provincial, and local public health regulations related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Public health guidance on measures for fully vaccinated, partially vaccinated, and unvaccinated individuals continue to evolve and could affect this policy.

This policy is effective immediately, with due regard for the availability of COVID-19 vaccines.

Vaccination Requirement and Records

All individuals who are required to be Fully Vaccinated (i.e.: including the 14-day period after receiving their completed dose) must achieve this status by **LAUNCH 2022 (April 23, 2022)**.

Any individual may be requested to present to **QCYC** evidence demonstrating that they have received the completed series of an Accepted COVID-19 Vaccine by **LAUNCH 2022**. Member Volunteers/Staff may view digital or hard copy documentation but at no point will the club keep a copy of any documentation.

Acceptable Documentation

Acceptable documentation serving as evidence of COVID-19 vaccination is a provincial government COVID-19 vaccine certificate equipped with a QR code.

Reporting and Record Keeping

Under Ontario Regulations, no organization is to retain and/or store any COVID-19 Proof of Vaccination related documentation. Any documentation related to COVID-19 vaccinations and accommodations will only be collected, used, retained, or disclosed by QCYC as permitted under the Regulations and may be necessary for legitimate operational purposes or as directed or requested by governmental authorities or as may be required for legal purposes.

Unvaccinated Affected Persons

Anyone who has not received their completed series of an Accepted COVID-19 Vaccine by **LAUNCH 2022**, will not be eligible to board a QCYC tender or enter any building on the QCYC grounds until such time as they present satisfactory evidence that they are Fully Vaccinated.
