The notation '[NP]' in a rule in the Notice of Race (NOR), Sailing Instructions (SIs) or other additional document that is a rule means that the penalty for a breach of that rule will not be grounds for a protest by a sailboat.

1 RULES

1.1 The Racing Rule(s) will be changed as outlined below.

1.1.1 [NP] RRS 62.1

Is modified to allow the Race Committee the ability to announce sailboats subject to RRS 29.1 on the applicable VHF Marine channel.

1.1.2 RRS 64.1

Is modified that for infringements of Part 2, the Jury may award a lesser penalty than DSQ, unless stated otherwise in the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions.

1.1.3 RRS A3

Is amended by adding the following:

If any handicap or rating system used in a QCYC Club Racing Events does not state the number of significant digits for the corrected time, the corrected time shall be calculated to the nearest second.

1.1.4 A5.3 applies to Wednesday Night Series 1, 2, and 3.

1.2 Class rule(s) will be changed as follows:

1.2.1 Any Class Rule prohibiting the carrying or the use of a VHF-FM marine radio is modified to allow the carrying or use of VHF-FM marine radio to:

- Receive any announcements of the Race Committee.
- Receive or transmit any emergency, security, or urgent radio communications.
- Communicate withdrawals to the Race Committee.

Assuming the Class Rules permit such a change to them.

1.3 Safety Regulations

1.3.1 Check In

Prior to the first race of the day, boats shall check in by sailing on starboard tack, close past the stern of the Race Committee vessel. After the First Warning, any boats not in the first start who have not yet checked in must keep clear of the starting area and must not sail past the Race Committee vessel until after the Warning Signal for their start has been given, at which time they should then check in.

1.3.2

Withdrawal

A boat withdrawing from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible, either by:

- Radioing the Race Committee vessel on VHF channel 69 (Canadian)
- Verbally as sailing past the Race Committee

Or

- Requesting another boat to relay the message.

1.4

The Organizing Authority has set up a system wherein skippers have been assigned a night to act as Race Officer. If a volunteer steps forward to fill the role, they will be permitted to race. Skippers will not be permitted to substitute another person for their assigned night although they may trade their assigned night for another with the designated skipper. In the event that they do so they must inform the Rear Commodore two weeks in advance. Also, members of their crew may be impressed into service on the Race Committee if needed.

The jobs or roles that may be fulfilled by such an impressment include:

- Assistant Race Officer (RO)
- Mark Layer (ML)
- Coxswain for MV Kay Walker
- Scorer
- Equipment or vessel maintenance

1.6

Observers are welcome to attend QCYC Club Racing Protests provided that:

- No party to the hearing objects
- Observers agree to conditions in the QCYC Club Racing Protest Observer Form and sign that form.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1

The Sailing Instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and Supplementary Sailing Instructions that will be <https://www.qcyc.ca/sailing/racing>.

COMMUNICATION

3.1

The official notice board is in the lobby of the QCYC Club House.

3.2

[DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on channels 09, 2, 16, 69 and 71 Canadian.

3.3

On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to

competitors on VHF radio on VHF channel 69 Canadian. Failure of the Race Committee to make a broadcast, the contents, including the order of information, the timing of a broadcast, or the failure of a boat to hear a broadcast shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 60.1(b).

- 3.4 [DP] From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a sailboat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all sailboats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1 All Events

- 4.1.1 The Person-in-Charge and all crew accepting the *QCYC Concussion Management Policy and Concussions Codes of Conduct*, available <https://www.qcyc.ca/hse/concussion>. An individual only must do this once annually for any QCYC event.

- 4.1.2 To be considered an entry in the event, a sailboat shall complete all registration requirements for that event.

- 4.1.3 The following restrictions on the number of sailboats apply: The number of sailboats and total number of competitors may be restricted by the Government of Ontario COVID-19 regulations or restrictions in place at the time of the race.

4.2 Wednesday Night Racing

- 4.2.1 These races are open to any sailboat that means the eligibility and entry requirement listed below from the City of Toronto that is from a yacht club that belongs to Ontario Sailing/Sail Canada or is a member of Ontario Sailing Maple Leaf Fund.

4.2.2 Classes

- 4.2.2.1 One Design: The event is open to all sailboats of the following classes:

Albacore, C420, RS 400, Shark, Soling, and Star.

- 4.2.2.2 Handicap: The event is open to all sailboats that have a valid PHRF-LO certificate. All racing under PHRF will be done under No Flying Sails (NFS). Depending on the number of sailboats registered that are racing PHRF, the PHRF class may be split into several classes.

- 4.2.2.3 Eligible sailboats may enter by completing the following before the sailboat's first race.

8 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

8.1 Each sailboat, racing under PHRF, shall produce or verify the existence of a valid rating certificate.

8.1.1 For Wednesday Night Racing, the QCYC OA may issue an interim rating based on the estimated expected PHRF-LO rating with a minus 60 seconds a mile. The sailboat will race in the PHRF class based on the interim rating without the assigned minus 30 seconds a mile.

13 RISK STATEMENT

13.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone. By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.'

14 INSURANCE

14.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$2,000,000 CAD per incident or the equivalent.
