### L.C.B.O. LOCKER RULES

1. No paint, varnish or inflammable material can be kept in the locker.
2. Consumption and/or presence of liquor, beer, wine or containers for same in lockers is prohibited.
3. Electrical wiring is installed to H.E.P.C. standards. NO ALTERATIONS WILL BE PERMITTED.
4. Regular H.E.P.C. and L.C.B.O. inspections will be conducted at THEIR discretion.
5. Locker alterations, done by the tenant, do not give priority on the locker or license to demand payment for same to any incoming tenant.
6. Locks are rented to the locker tenant at nominal fee and MUST be surrendered with keys when vacating.

INFRACTION OF THESE RULES WILL MEAN INDEFINITE LOSS OF LOCKER PRIVILEGES.
