WELCOME, L. Y. R. A. CONTESTANTS!

The Flag Officers and Members of the Queen City Yacht Club extend a warm welcome to participants in the 1969 Lake Yacht Racing Association Long Distance Race and Regatta. We hope your visit to Toronto will be enjoyable, and our various committees have worked hard to make it so. The information in this Regatta Edition of the QCYC Clipper will be useful during your stay here, and will help you to locate facilities and services both at the Club and in the city. We have a staff of ladies on duty at the clubhouse to answer your questions and help in any way they can.

Cash Coupons only, please!

Please note that NO CASH will be handled either at the bar or in the dining room during LYRA Week. The Ladies Committee sells Cash Coupons at several locations, and we ask you to use them exclusively. In addition to the meal tickets in larger denominations, we offer books of Cash Coupons in denominations of 5c, 10c and 25c. Although the tickets enclosed are imprinted "For bar use only", they are acceptable, during LYRA Week, for purchases in the dining room as well, and may be used as fares on the Club Tender to the City. However, they will not be accepted for payment at the gas pump: tender cash only there, please. The books of Cash Coupons contain 10 tickets of 5c each, 20 tickets of 10c and 10 tickets of 25c denomination, for a total of \$5.00 per book. Verify the number of coupons in the book at the time of purchase, and note that the unused coupons are redeemable for cash any time up to 5.00 p.m. SUNDAY, AUGUST 10 ONLY.

Identification Badges

With this folder you will be given identification badges for yourself and your crew and guests, unless you are carrying a membership card in a Yacht Club or other suitable identification. Please wear the badge or carry your card, and be prepared to identify yourself and party at all times. This is necessary in order to preserve some semblance of security around the clubhouse and in the grounds. The Security Guards have instructions to question all visitors to the club, so avoid causing a situation for yourself and crew: please co-operate in this request.

The identification badges are printed on pressure-sensitive stock. To apply, bend the badge forward to split the backing sheet, which may then be peeled off in two sections, exposing the gummed surface.

All times are FROM THE CLUB. The tender leaves the foot of York Street 15 minutes after the times listed above. Fare is four for \$1.00, and the tender operator has tickets for sale. BAR COUPONS ARE ALSO ACCEPTABLE AS TENDER FARES, and any ticket or combination of tickets to make 25c may be used.

Any variation of the above schedule, or other club arrangements, will be posted on the bulletin board at the front entrance.

Paging

Marg Pitcher, Chairman of the Ladies Committee, has announced that all paging of visitors will be done every hour on the hour. By alerting our guests to this schedule, it is hoped that there will be a better chance of contacting those being paged. Between these times you would be well advised to check with the information desk occasionally, to see whether you might have missed any messages.
