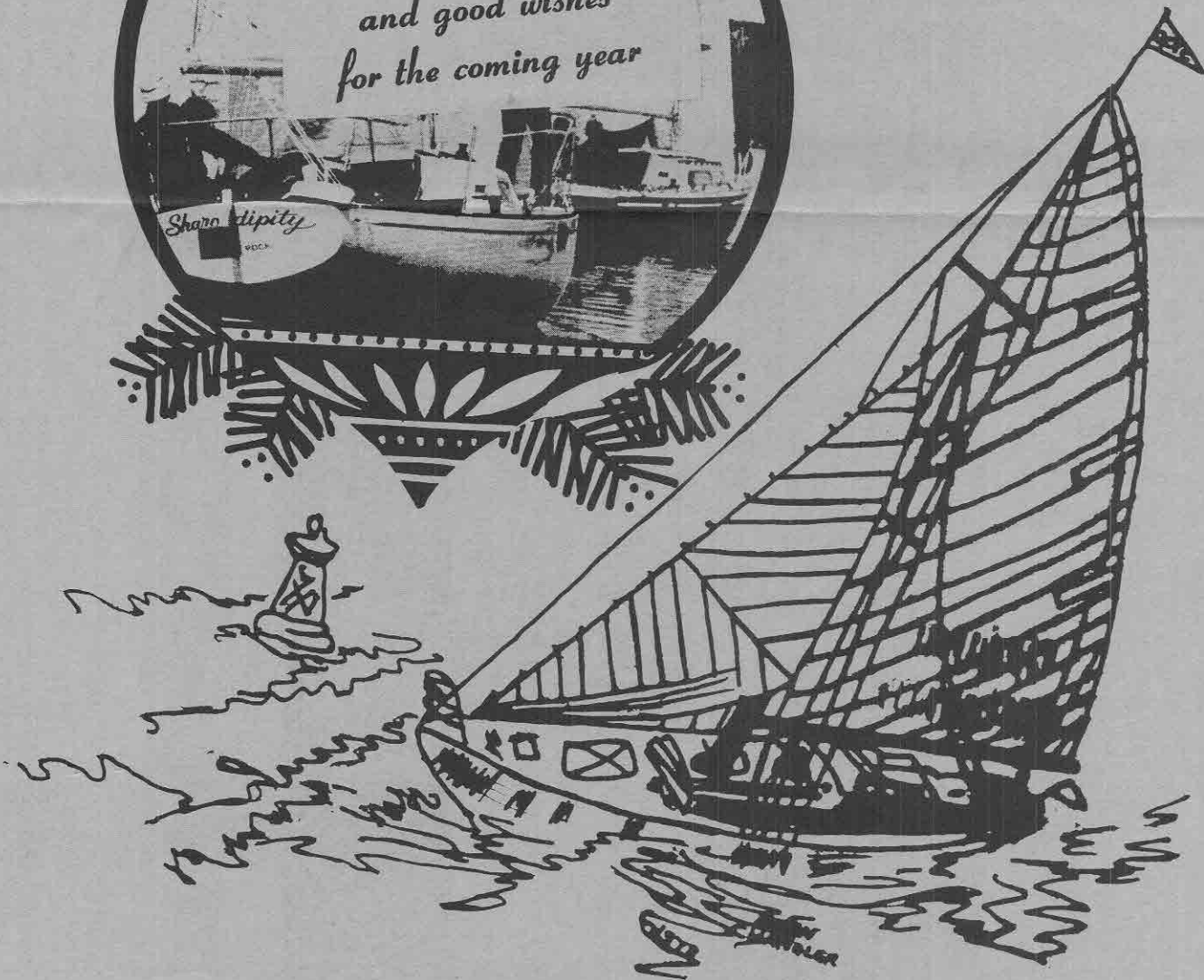

Riddle's Better Boat Pictures Booked for January:

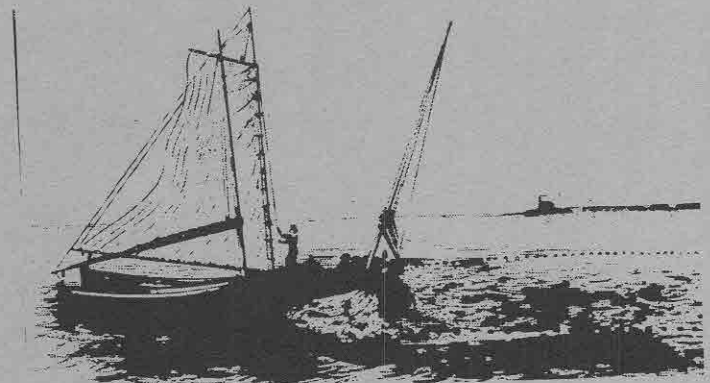

FOR QUEEN CITY YACHT CLUB :

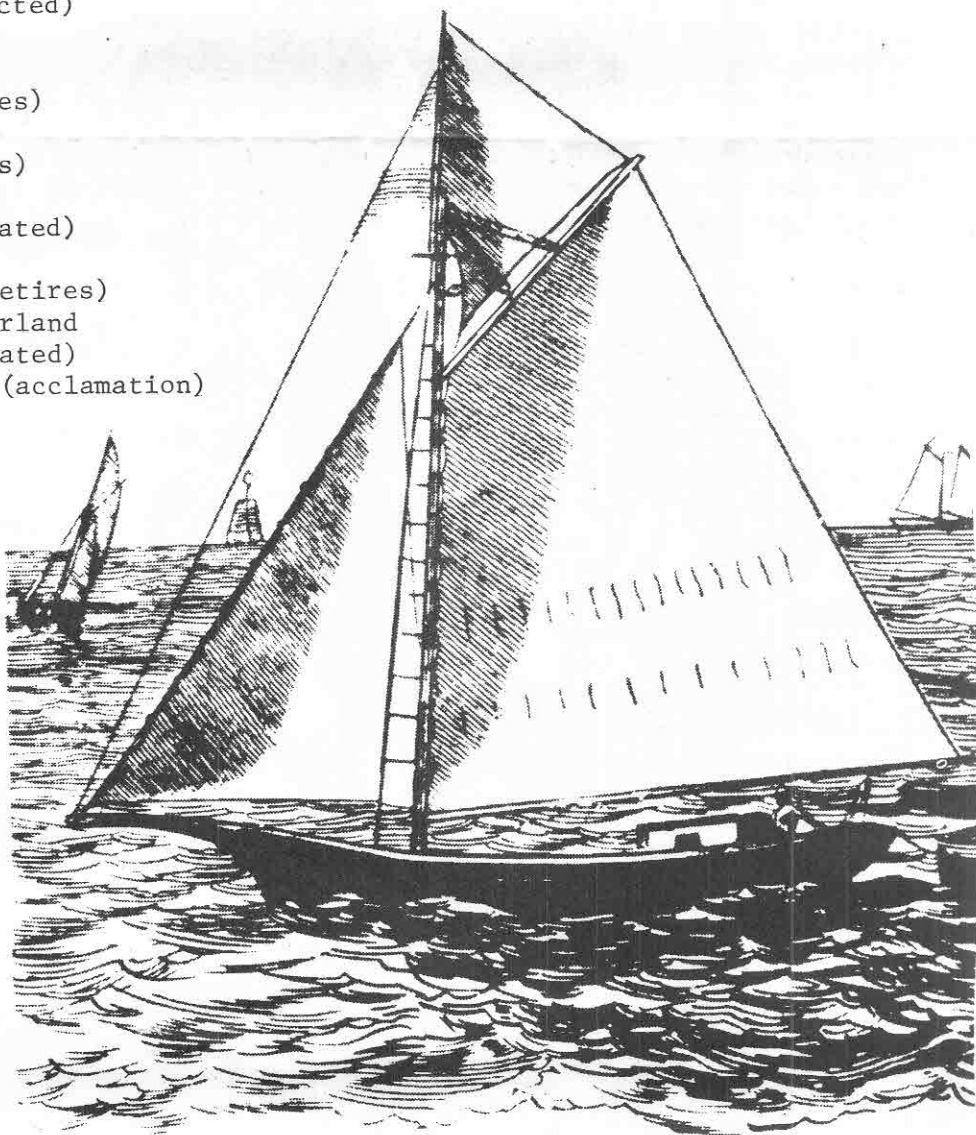
