VICE COMMODORES REPORT

Your Board and Management Committee are extremely concerned over the ever escalating costs of being a member at Queen City Yacht Club. We realize that we cannot go on year after year increasing the membership fees or adding assessments without this causing hardships to some of our members.

This year, aiming for a breakeven situation, we are forced to increase the membership fees by some 20%. If we were to continue this way we would double our membership fees in four years.

I am sure that we are all aware that although it is not our intention to make a profit, our only source of income other than membership dues comes from our Clubhouse through the expenditure on food and beverage by members and guests. Therefore, to keep dues at a stable level we must collect income from the operation of the Clubhouse.

This can only be accomplished in a few ways. We can try for increased use of the Clubhouse by membership. This may happen, but I honestly believe that our current level of \$120,000 per year would be very difficult to improve upon. We could reduce the level of service, a course of action which I do not believe is in the best interest of either the members or the Club. We could maintain both turnover and service but introduce a strict control over the day to day operation of the Club to enable the Board to monitor the performance of the Clubhouse over the length of the season not just once a year.

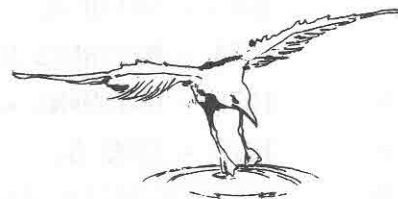
After many hours of deliberation, your Board has reluctantly come to the conclusion that a change of Management in both philosophy and personnel is unavoidable and to this end the Board of Directors voted unanimously to appoint Norman Steele of Teele Management Services to manage our Club in the coming season.

Norman Steele has met with your Commodore and other Board members on many occasions, we are all confident that the Clubhouse in the coming year should contribute its share to the over-all revenue of the Club.

The following is the final list of Senior Membership of the Club. I believe you have all had the chance to make comments on this list and hope that it is acceptable to everyone. Really, the only significant part of this list are the members who have joined in the last few years and these are well documented in the Club records. However, I hope those members who have been with us forever will not be too concerned if their name is one or two positions out of place.

At the opening of the season a locker list will be published within the Club offices, anyone wishing to check his position should refer to this list.

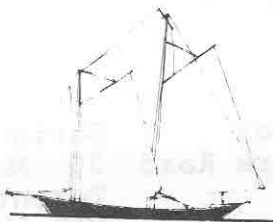
FROM THE TREASURER

Several years ago, the concept of Interim Billing to senior members in the fall of each year was introduced in QCYC. Three main purposes were to be served by this procedure. Firstly, yard storage fees for the coming winter season could be collected. Secondly, by including mooring and locker fees for the following season, advance information could be obtained by the mooring chairman of which members would not be requiring moorings for the next summer.

With this information, planning of moorings and early notice of availability of moorings to members on the waiting list could be completed in good time for everyone. Finally, and most importantly from the Treasurer's point of view, the Interim Billing would provide the income necessary to cover continuing expenses through the winter months, when the Club has no other source of revenue. However, it is my unhappy duty to inform the membership that the system is not working properly. In spite of reminder letters sent out in November, there are still 30 senior members (approximately 20 percent of the total) whose accounts are not in good standing since the September billing.

Since it has not been Club policy in the past to charge interest on overdue accounts, all members must ultimately share the interest expenses (high at current rates) which the Club incurs as a result of delinquent accounts.

A long-term solution to this problem may be to start charging interest to overdue accounts. There are both advantages and disadvantages to such a policy, but it is one I think your Board should consider under the present circumstances. However, the short-term solution is for all members to settle their accounts as quickly as possible.



Accordingly, the Board of Directors at its February 12 meeting established the policy that ANY MEMBER WHO HAS NOT PAID HIS INTERIM BILLING IN FULL BY MARCH 15, 1980 RELINQUISHES HIS OR HER MOORING RIGHTS FOR THE 1980 SEASON.

This expediting measure does not apply to the February membership billing which you should have received by the time you read this. However, prompt payment of the latter invoice will also greatly assist in the financial operation of your Club and eliminate the need for draconian collection measures in the future.
