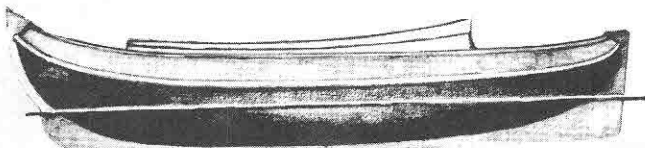

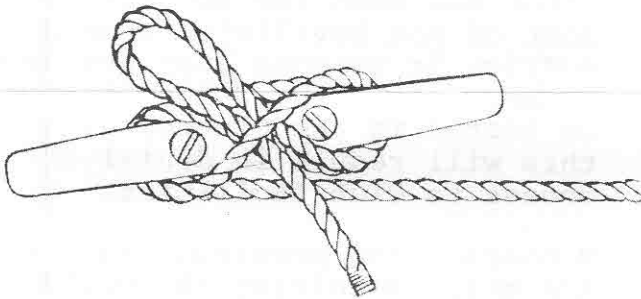
CRUISERS PLEASE NOTE:

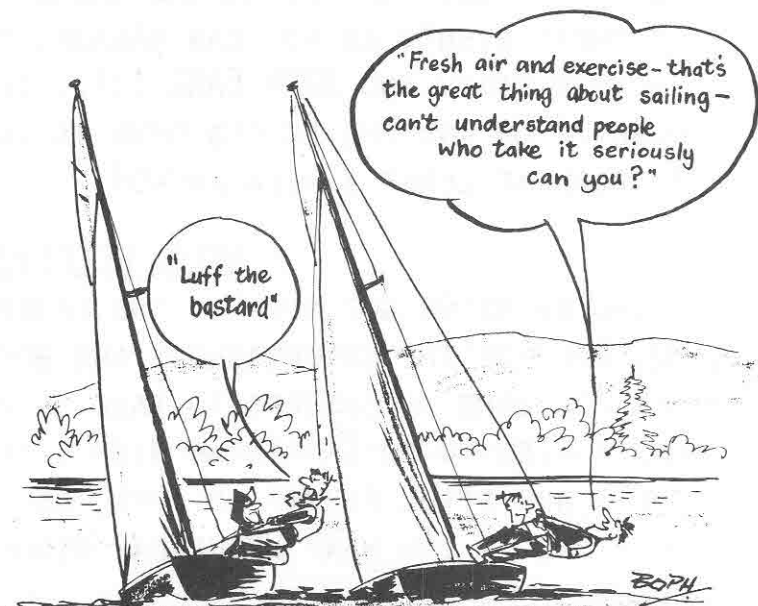
RACING RESULTS
