

HOUSE COMMITTEE REPORT

The first problem facing us this year is hiring staff. We will have two familiar faces back, Jimmy Douglas and Craig Green. I have been interviewing potential catering and janitorial staff. By the opening of the season we plan to have a full-time maintenance janitor just keeping the clubhouse clean. Jimmy and Craig will be looking after the grounds and yard.

I want to operate within last year's budget. To that end, I have worked on three criteria: 1: Food; 2: Cleanliness of the club; and 3: Cost.

With the exception of the holiday weekends, it is planned to continue last year's practice of closing the clubhouse all day Monday. I would like members to re-evalute the use of the Great Hall on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We would like to return the dining room and small bar to their original concepts. on those days. That is, to offer over-the-bar service -- a hot meal, soup, sandwiches etc. This way we can save some money on staff costs. The times of operation will have to be altered to run in conjunction with the tender schedules. It is being suggested that the bar be open from 4:30pm to 8:30pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays. But the final times of operation will be published before the season begins in earnest.

Bar prices will be maintained at last year's level. We hope this will establish a greater volume of sales. We feel it's better that you support the club by using its facilities rather than being hit with an assessment at the end of the year. For the Easter Weekend, we are planning a limited food service. The dining room will be open from 9am to 3pm. The bar hours will be noon to 5:30pm.
