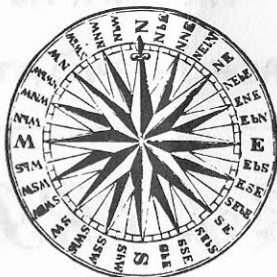

TREASURER'S REPORT

BILLINGS

There has been some confusion about the nature of member's billings and the terms of payment. There are generally two billings sent out each year.

1. Fall Billing:

On or about September 1, containing the following items:

- (a) winter storage for the coming winter;
- (b) moorings for the next season;
- (c) lockers for the next season; and
- (d) assessments, if any, for the current year.

The primary reason for the fall billing is to obtain an indication, through payments received, of continuing members to enable the membership chairman to identify the number of moorings available for new members; the moorings chairman to allocate moorings, and the vice-commodore to allocate lockers. Payment of this billing also provides funds for the club to pay expenses incurred during the winter months.

2. Spring Billing:

On or about January 1, containing the following items:

- (a) membership fees for the current year;
- (b) minimum billing amount for the current year;
- (c) tender pass fees for the current year; and
- (d) initiation instalments, if any.

3. Other Billings:

Other billings are rendered on an individual basis throughout the year for debentures, initiation and other adjustments as they arise.

Payment Terms

1. All billings are due when rendered. If payment is a problem, please contact the Treasurer.

General Rules

1. Fees and charges are not refundable.
2. Members are not "in good standing" according to the Constitution of the Club, if billings are unpaid by March 31.
3. Boats will not be hauled for winter storage unless the member has paid or made arrangements with the Treasurer.

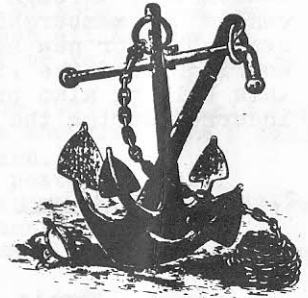
4. Boats will not be launched in the spring unless the member has paid or made arrangements with the Treasurer.
5. If the fall billing is unpaid at December 31, the member loses locker and mooring privileges and the locker and mooring may be allocated to another member.
6. Beginning with the fall billing this season, delinquent members will be published in The Clipper if their billings are unpaid after 60 days or arrangements for payment have not been made with the Treasurer.

Communication

If you have questions relating to your billing, please write to the Club; it is too easy to forget conversations.

If there is any problem with your billing or with payment, please contact the Treasurer. We do not wish to lose members because of temporary cash flow problems and payment arrangements can be made. We need to know what your intentions are as the long term financial health of the club requires that all possible moorings be filled.
