HAULOUT & WORK PARTIES

The summer is gone. The time has come to prepare the yard for haulout. To do that we are devoting one weekend to the laying of ways, the clearing up of debris, and all of the other tasks that must be done before the boats can come out of the water.

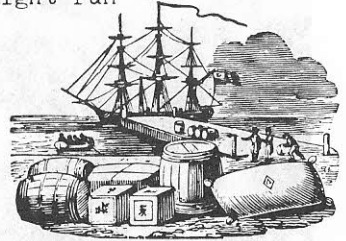

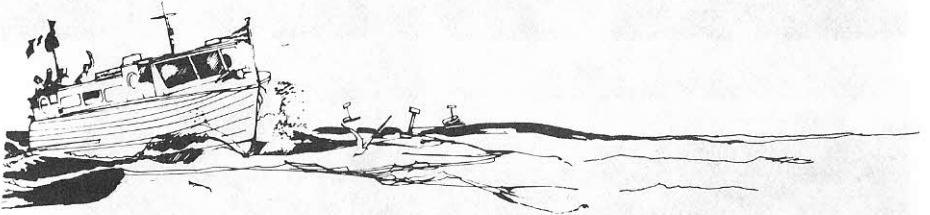
