

FLEET CAPTAIN

We are rapidly closing out the season and that means haulout is upon us. I know we all have our own methods of putting our boats up for the winter, but, here are just a few reminders of things to do.

- 1. Fill up your fuel tank so as not to allow condensation to form.
- 2. Change your oil and filter. Don't worry about your used oil. We have an agreement with the outer harbour marina to take it.
- 3. Pump your holding tank out, flush it and pump it out again.
- 4. Winterize your head by pouring anti-freeze into the bowl. This will take care of the downstream side, but you have to protect the suction side as well so you must find a way to get anti-freeze into the suction side of the pump as well.
- 5. Check your impellor on your cooling water intake to make sure


that there are no broken teeth or blades.

- 6. If you can get at your water tanks. empty them and clean them out with baking soda.
- 7. If you have a pressure water system there is a non-toxic anti-freeze to run through the system. *Don't forget to drain the hot water tank!*
- 8. Make sure batteries are charged fully and are topped up with water.
- 9. Take your electronics home, because they don't react well to cold and dampness.

I could go on, but I'm sure you have a list of your own.

As Terri and I are going to Europe during haulout we won't see any of you, so I hope everybody has a safe haulout and a good time at the presentation dinner.


Protect our investment in the club.
