If you want to eat, a fine Italian meal will be available for \$10 each. As a courtesy, you might let the ABYC dining room know you're coming.

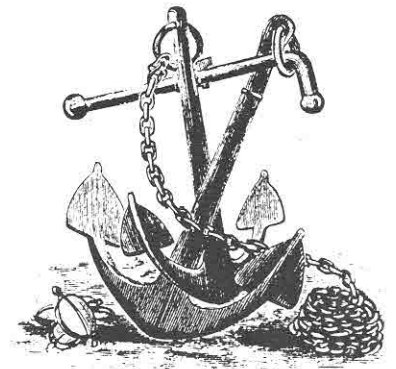
Otherwise, there's always the Snug Bar on weekends which I usually manage to make on at least one day. Call me ahead of time if you want to be sure of meeting (971-9171).

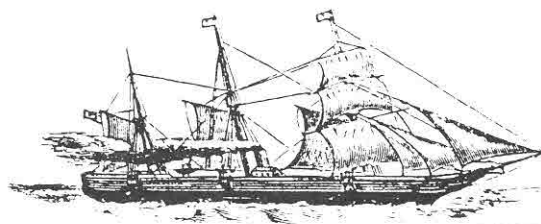
In closing, I will take this opportunity to thank Mike Shawyer and last year's Board members. You worked hard during 1989 and you can be assured that your efforts are much appreciated.

VICE COMMODORE



Since this is the first *Clipper* of the New Year I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a happy, healthy and prosperous New Year.

It's hard to believe that with all the snow and ice in the year, we will be ready to launch again in less than three months.

The new management committee has already met to discuss 1991 operations. I think it is important to let everyone know just what is the function of the management committee.

First, it is not an executive committee that would direct the activities of the Board of Directors, it is actually an operations committee, charged with overseeing the day to day activities of the Club.

The members include the House Chairman, the Fleet Captain, the Treasurer and the Vice Commodore, who chairs the committee. The commodore is an ex-officio member.

The management committee also makes recommendations to the Board on matters including fee structures, capital expenditures and outside contracting, including the dining room operations. The Board considers, discusses and often amends these recommendations before ratification, however no policy decisions are made at the management committee, only the full Board can make club policy.

We will all try to remain open and approachable so that your ideas, recommendations and complaints will be heard and acted upon to ensure that QCYC remains your Club.

Every month I shall update you on the progress, and future plans so watch this space for new information.

1991 will be run on a very tight budget. We do not plan to have Capital Projects Billings. As a result no major capital expenditures are

planned. This does not mean that nothing will be happening; locker roofs still need to be replaced, the Club House still needs major repairs and the Club boats are aging rapidly.

All monies for these projects will come from operating revenues so tight financial controls will have to be implemented to make sure that we don't sacrifice the high QCYC standards while keeping costs to a minimum.

Regarding the spring billing, this year's policy, approved at the January Board meeting, is that the member's bills must be paid in full before the boat will be launched. Cash, cheques, Visa and Mastercard will be accepted for payment. Post dated cheques will be accepted, but must be dated no later than May 31, 1991. If a member's cheque is returned N.S.F. or for any other reason, the member's privileges will be revoked and they will not be allowed to use the Club facilities

until the total balance is paid in full, including a \$10.00 cheque charge for the returned cheques. Let's communicate.
