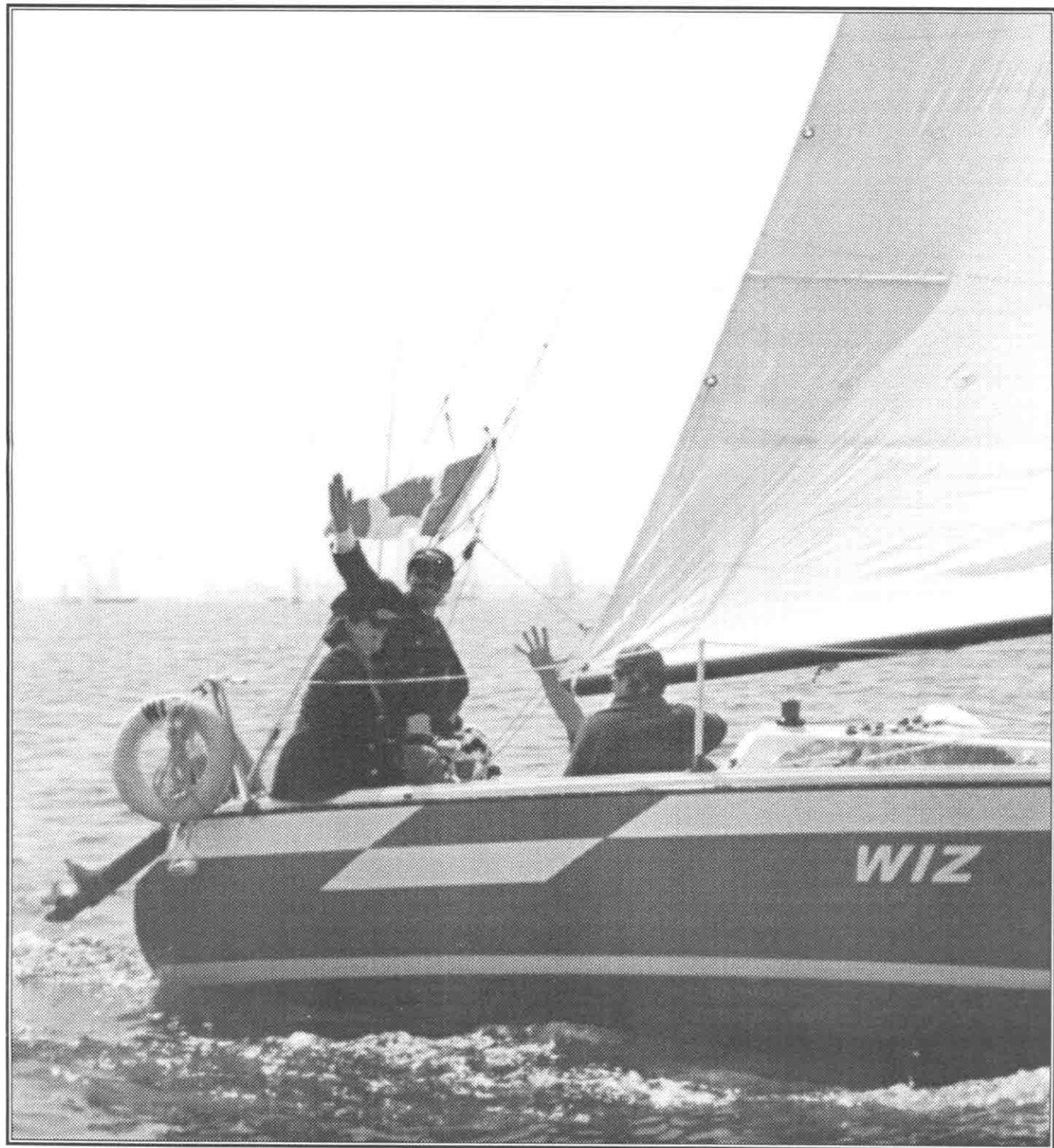

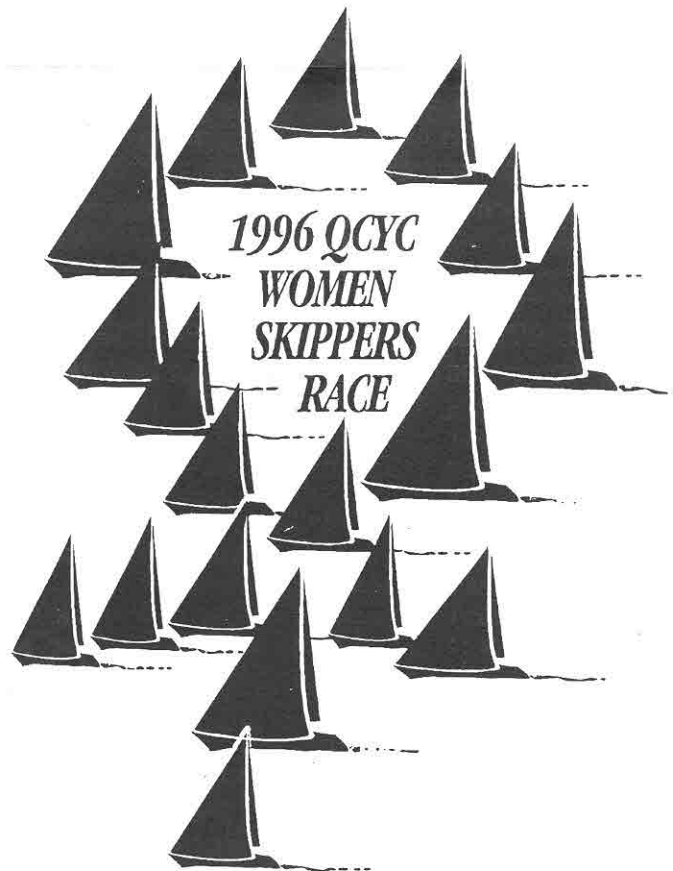

YARD

This will probably be the last report before haulout so will try to cover most of the need to know stuff. Since the cradles were inspected in the Spring there has not been much activity in the yard to repair cradles or paint out old names so you guys better get moving. Some of the cradles will be converting to steel king planks. I will be recommending to the Board a king plank replacement program which should save us from last minute disasters. I may need to have another quick inspection to make sure there was no further deterioration during the summer.

There will be a **mast crane inspection course** since we had some problems with mast stepping in the

Spring. While I am on the subject of masts, please stuff a rag or newspaper into the foot of your mast before storing for the Winter. Our feathered friends don't realize that their nests, next year, will be moved before the chicks have learned to fly. We will be having a **yard work party** on September 21st to rebuild some ways and do a general cleanup before haulout starts.

I understand I have been appointed to the safety committee and thought the following story would be helpful to everyone. On Saturday, August 24 we had a bizarre accident while sailing with our friend **Jim Yates** on his boat *Navair*. While sailing along at about 3 knots the arrow from the Windex fell

from the masthead and stabbed Marlyn on the left knee. The point penetrated about one inch. If you look at the way this thing is designed it does not need a sharp point since the vanes at the other end do all the work. I would recommend the point of the Windex be cut off about an inch or two back.

I can't think of anything else to say at this time. Just remember I don't want any surprises on haulout weekend. I leave you with some reminders from launch.
