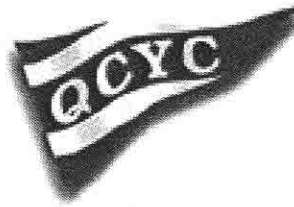

Message from the Commodore

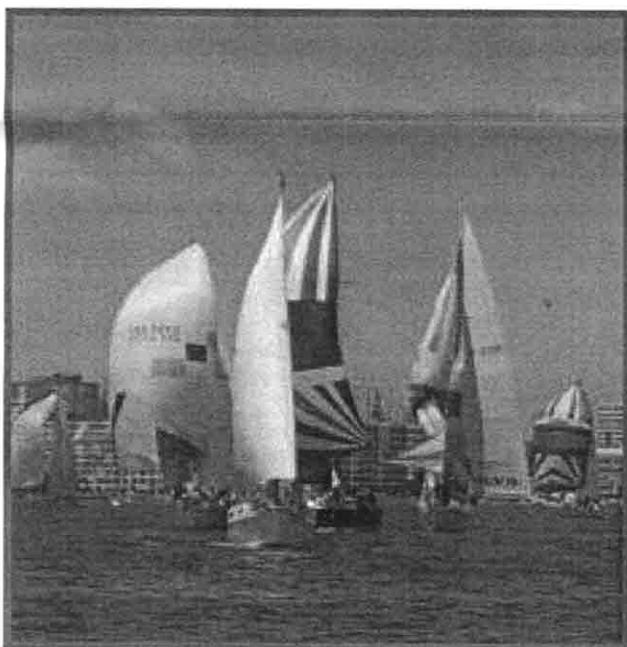

Not just weeds sprouting

Weeds aren't the only things growing in the yard and preventing staff and the stalwart whacking crew from keeping things tidy.

By the July long weekend, bikes lined most ways. There are pontoons, masts and booms in a number of areas.

If you have a bike chained or leaned against a way, please move it to the bike rack. If you have other pieces of marine equipment leaning against cradles, please move it to a more appropriate work area. Having scrutinized Gib Speight's cradle report, members will soon begin working on their cradles, and will often need to move them. Someone else's bike or pontoons preventing that is annoying – and there's no telling what might happen to your stuff if others take it upon themselves to move it.
