CANADIAN OARSMEN WON ALL THEIR RACES

Len Marsh of the Dons and C. W. Johnston of Winnipeg Qualify in Senior Singles—Winnipeg Eight Won the Trial Heat and Final in a Great Race.

Philadelphia, July 19.—"Canada should be proud of her oarsmen's performance here to-day. Winnipeg winning their trial and final in the intermediate eight, and Johnston, the Winnipeg entry, and Marsh of the Dons winning the two trial heats for the association singles in hollow fashion. The critics look for a punishing finish in the senior eight between Argonauts and the champion Vesper outfit, but very little Vesper money at better than even. Our crew is perfectly fit."

Philadelphia, July 19.—Under conditions that could not be improved upon the first day's races of the twenty-ninth annual regatta of the National Association of Amateur Rowers were held on the Schuylkill River, in Fairmount Park, this afternoon, and the initial day's sport was in every way a success. Winnipeg carried off the honors, while St. Louis, Worcester, Toronto, Philadelphia, Detroit, and New York each had men placed. The Canadians won everything in which they were entered. All the races were a mile and a half with a turn, with the exception of the eight, which were rowed straight away for the same distance. In the heats the first two qualified.

THE INTERMEDIATE EIGHTS. The regatta opened with the trial heats of the intermediate eight-oared sides. The Malta Boat Club, Winnipeg, and West Philadelphia competed in the first heat. The Malts secured the lead at the start, but it was never more than half a length. The others being out of the race, the Malts won the trolley bridge, the half-way mark, Coxswain Logan of the Winnipeg called on his crew for a spurt. The Manitobans hit their stroke up to 40 and in the next quarter of a mile put open water between themselves and the Malts, rowing in perfect form, and gradually increased their lead, going across the line two lengths ahead of the Malts, who were the same distance ahead of West Philadelphia.

The second heat was a grand struggle between the two representatives from Gotham, the New York Athletic Club and the Nonpareil Rowing Club, second place. The Nonpareil Rowing Association crew was never headed after they had taken the lead at the end of the first quarter mile, the Nonpareils being unable to hold the slight lead they secured at the start. It was not until the tuck between the New Yorkers and the Malts, with New York A. C. taking second place by a few feet.

The crews then rested until everybody else was through, when they came out for the final struggle. The event was desperately contested, and the thousands of persons along the course cheered the oarsmen every time they dipped their blades into the water. Winnipeg led the contest, with Malta next; then came Fairmount, and the New York A. C. was on the west side. Fairmount caught the water first, but the Malts quickly overcame this advantage, and a hundred yards from the start got the bow of their shell in front. The Malts, Fairmount, and Winnipeg had a desperate contest for the lead, with the New Yorkers, with their famous English stroke, losing ground continually. The Malts continued to hold their slight advantage to the trolley bridge, three-quarters of a mile from the start, but Winnipeg managed to secure second place, at this point. At the half-way mark, a trolley bridge a length separated the three boats. The Fairmounts then recovered some of their lost ground by a well timed stroke, but they were unable to hold it, and the Malts took the lead.

up to forty, and foot by foot they crawled up on the Malts. The latter were caught half a mile from the finish, but they stuck to their work manfully. It was impossible, however, to hold the great crew from Winnipeg, who, rowing in beautiful style, with out a break of any kind, splendidly steered by Coxswain Logan, crossed the finishing line two lengths ahead of the Malts, who were a length ahead of the Fairmounts, while the New Yorkers were beaten by fully eight lengths. The time, 7:54 1/4, was simply remarkable, and speaks volumes for the ability of the Malts, who are undoubtedly one of the best crews ever seen on the Schuylkill.

TORONTO'S WON EASILY. Len Marsh of the Dons, Toronto, easily defeated Jas. Bond of Philadelphia in the first heat of the association singles. C. W. Johnston of Winnipeg won the second heat in much faster time. The only unfortunate incident was the Niagara Union of C. S. Titus of the Union Boat Club of New York. Titus finished second in this heat, after he and C. W. Johnston were overhauled by several lengths. Titus failed to turn his buoy, and he was disqualified.

The surprise of the afternoon was the defeat of the Vesper senior four, composed of members of the world's champion crew, by the St. Louis four. Ten Eyck and Lewis had no trouble in the senior double. The intermediate double shell event was also rowed in heat. In the first trial the visiting crews captured both the places from the Crescents and the Vespers. The Detroit crew won out by a length and a half from the New York A. C., with Crescents a close third. The Harlem Rowing Club of New York City had a row over in the second heat, the Malts and the Atlantis declining the issue. Summary.

The trial races to select a Canada's Cup defender commenced to-day at Chicago. The Royal St. Lawrence Yacht Club in last night chose Mr. Abbott's Sonnet as the defender of the Senawhaka Cup against the Grey Friar, owned by Mr. Lorne Currie of the Islay Club, England. Capt. "Kid" Wilds' Canada's cup boat, Detroit, had a wild time making Chicago from Milwaukee for the trial races. After passing Kenosha a storm broke, and she was close reefed and all her head canvas doused. Even that was too much for her, and her mainsail was stowed, and she ran under bare poles. She was driven into Chicago harbor she was almost cut down by the steamer Marion, which missed her in the gloom by only 10 feet. Marion passed a line and towed her inside. In a brush down Chicago bay, with a 25-mile breeze blowing, Detroit and Cadillac broke even, both beating Minota, the Canadian boat, and Orion of Milwaukee.

FISHERS AT WORK AGAIN. The Vancouver Board of Trade Effects a Settlement of the Strike. THREE STRAIGHTS FOR TORONTOS

Montreal Badly Beaten in the Final Game of the Series at Diamond Park—Great Team Play of the Locals, on the Field and at the Bat.

Toronto 12, Montreal 2. The Bees showed their class before 2,600 people at Diamond Park yesterday afternoon by taking the third straight game from the visitors, and like amateurs trying to get their release. The infield went to pieces at critical moments, until Charley Doohan, the Montreal pitcher, and Dan McFarlan had much to do with the ragged work of the Montreal team. McFarlan was as wild as the traditional hawk, and when he did get them over the plate the Toronto batter and ball player were the lot. It was a picnic for the Bees, although McFarlan's in-sults were always a source of danger to right-hand batters. McFarlan's most remarkable feat was performing a revolution in the third inning. He retired the side on strikes, didn't give his team a chance to field the ball so as to get a put out, hit two batters, and was batted safely four times, four runs scoring.

On the other hand, "Pop" Williams pitched in his best form. He never extended himself to the limit, but always had something up his sleeve. In the ninth inning he let loose and struck two men out, just to show how much he had left. The Toronto players snappy, aggressive ball all the time, Hargrove contributing a magnificent running catch in the third inning. The team play of the locals at the bat was a revelation to the crowd, and under Manager Barrow's direction, they "played the game" to the finish.
