WHO'LL BE SENIOR C.L.A. CHAMPIONS? RUNNING RACES AT EXHIBITION

Toronto People Inclined to Favor the St. Catharines Athletics. Pat Gallagher Had Two Winners in Abingdon and Snowstorm.

Judging by the enthusiasm displayed, the most popular attraction of the afternoon in front of the grand stand at the Exhibition yesterday afternoon were the running races. Pat Gallagher rode two winners, Abingdon at 3 to 5 and Snowstorm at 3 to 1. Gallagher was much the superior jockey, and his skill on the saddle gave him both victories. One of the Queen's Plate race-players, Kaslo, led the open race very prominently in two straight heats. He was handled by young Thompson of Barrie, a brother of Lorne, the Dymc's jockey. Kaslo always held the race well in hand. Dot had her pony race practically won when she bolted out of the eastern gate, which had been opened by some careless official. The summary:
