A TEMPERANCE RESOLUTION.

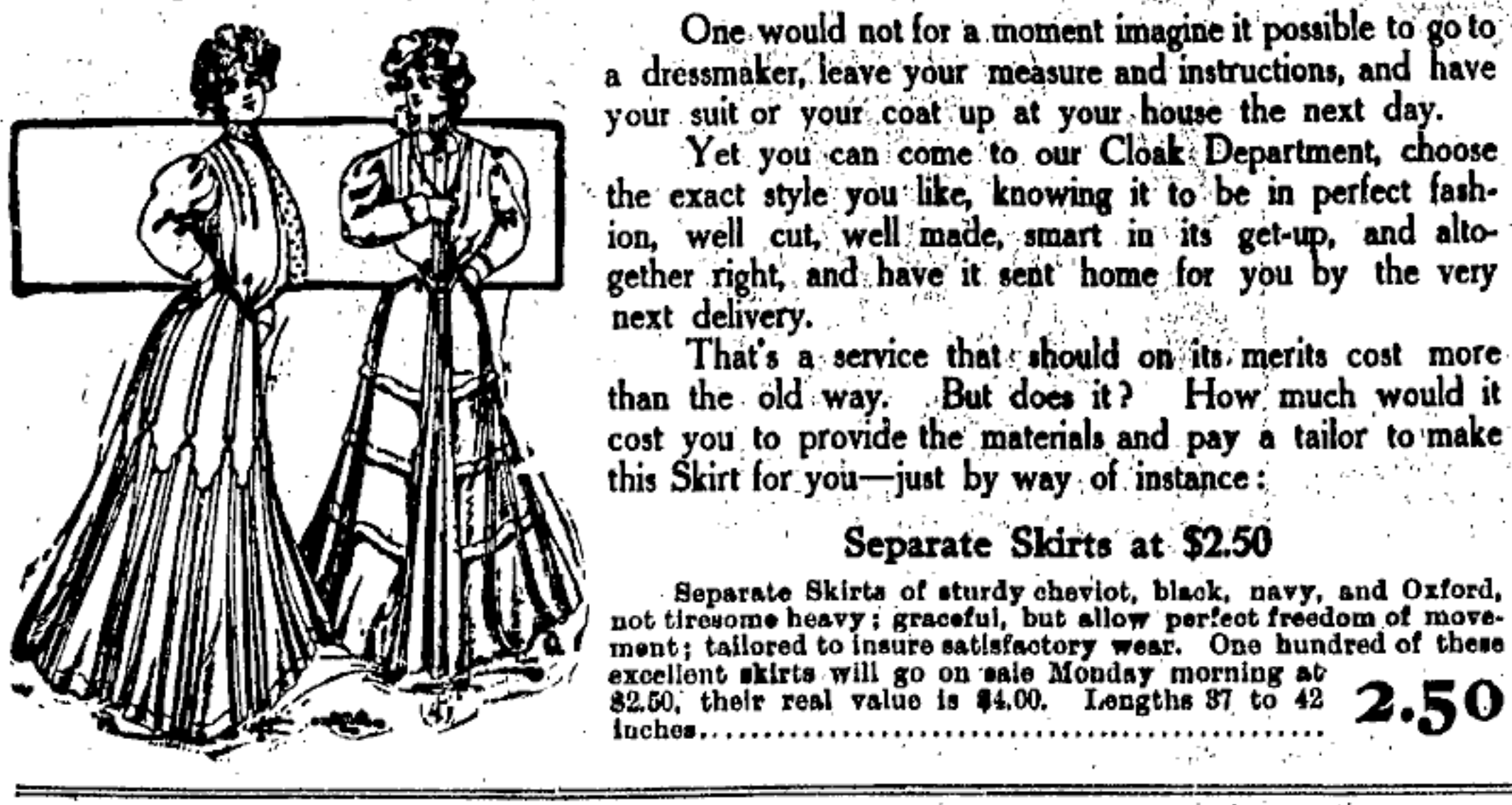
