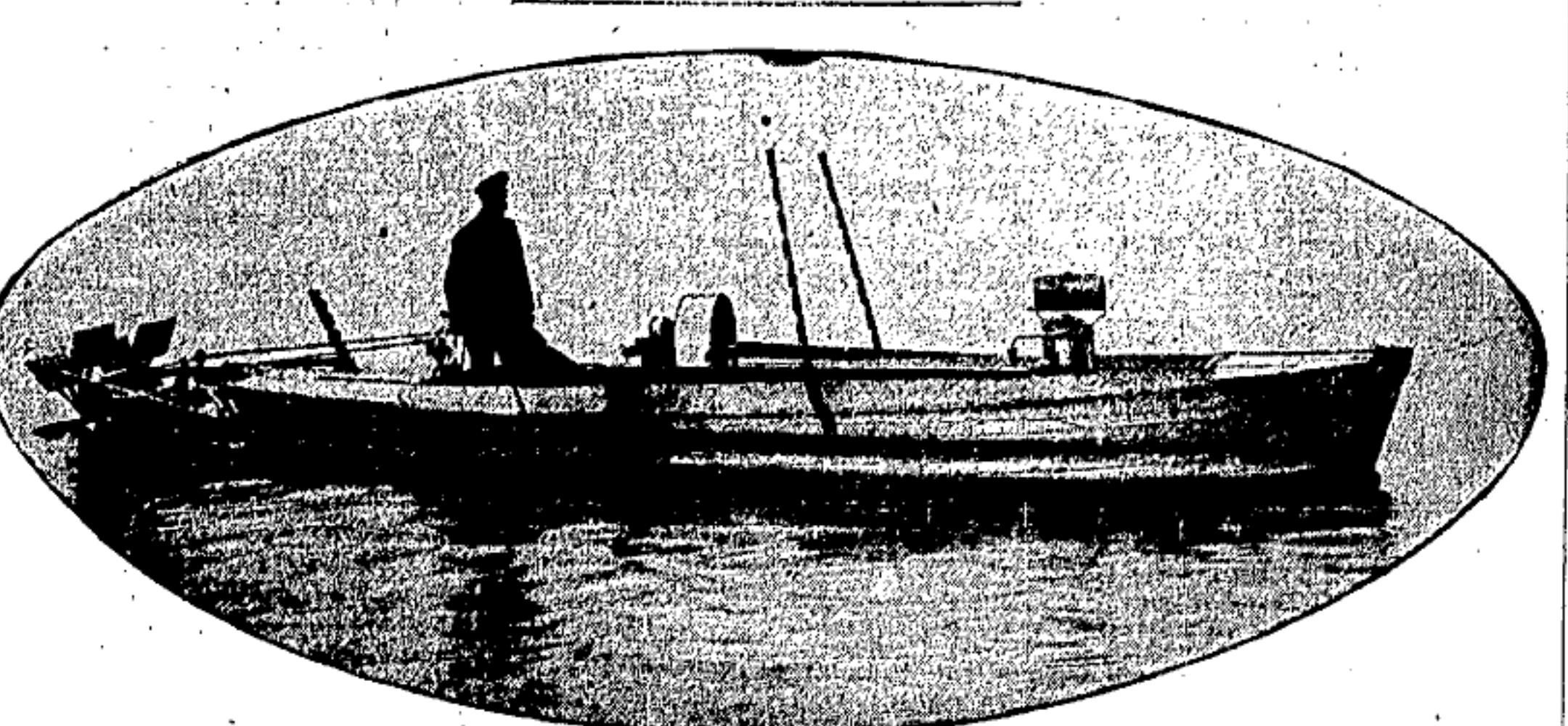

LATEST ADDITION TO TORONTO'S FLEET THE CITY'S MOTOR BOAT WEED CUTTER



Painted Bright Red.

The long low boat, with its knuckled leg amidships, is what caused Commodore to call it the grasshopper.

The weed cutter is a flat-bottomed boat, with square bilges and square stern. It has a wedge-shaped bow.

The boat is 26 feet over all, and five feet beam. It draws about six inches of water, and has a peculiar arrangement of its propelling apparatus.

It can be operated anywhere there has been a good dew. The weed cutter is propelled by double paddle wheels which are set out astern of her.

These paddle wheels also act as a steering gear. The shaft leading to the paddle wheels has a knuckle and the steering gear switches the paddles from one side to the other, thus maneuvering the boat by its own power.

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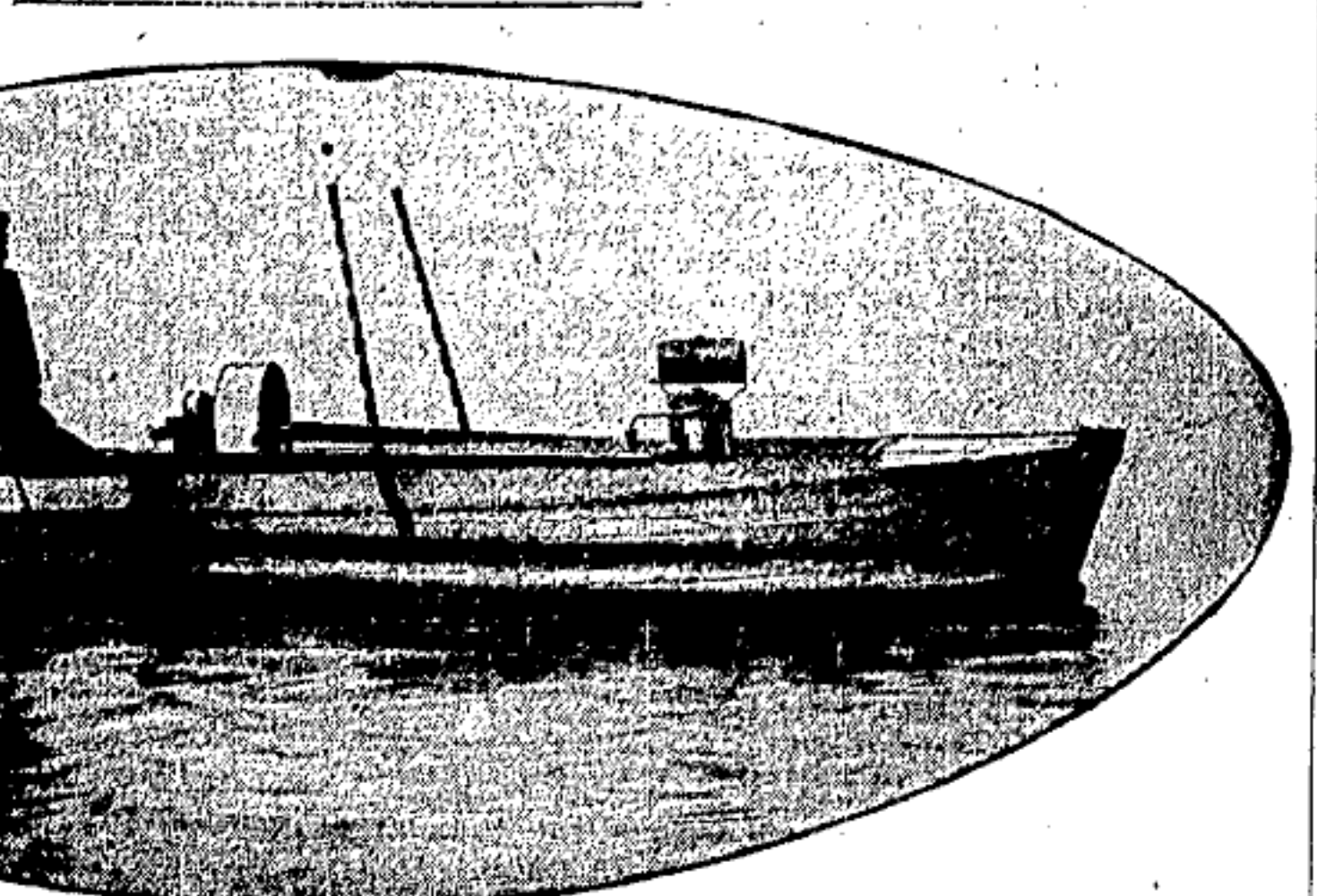
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
