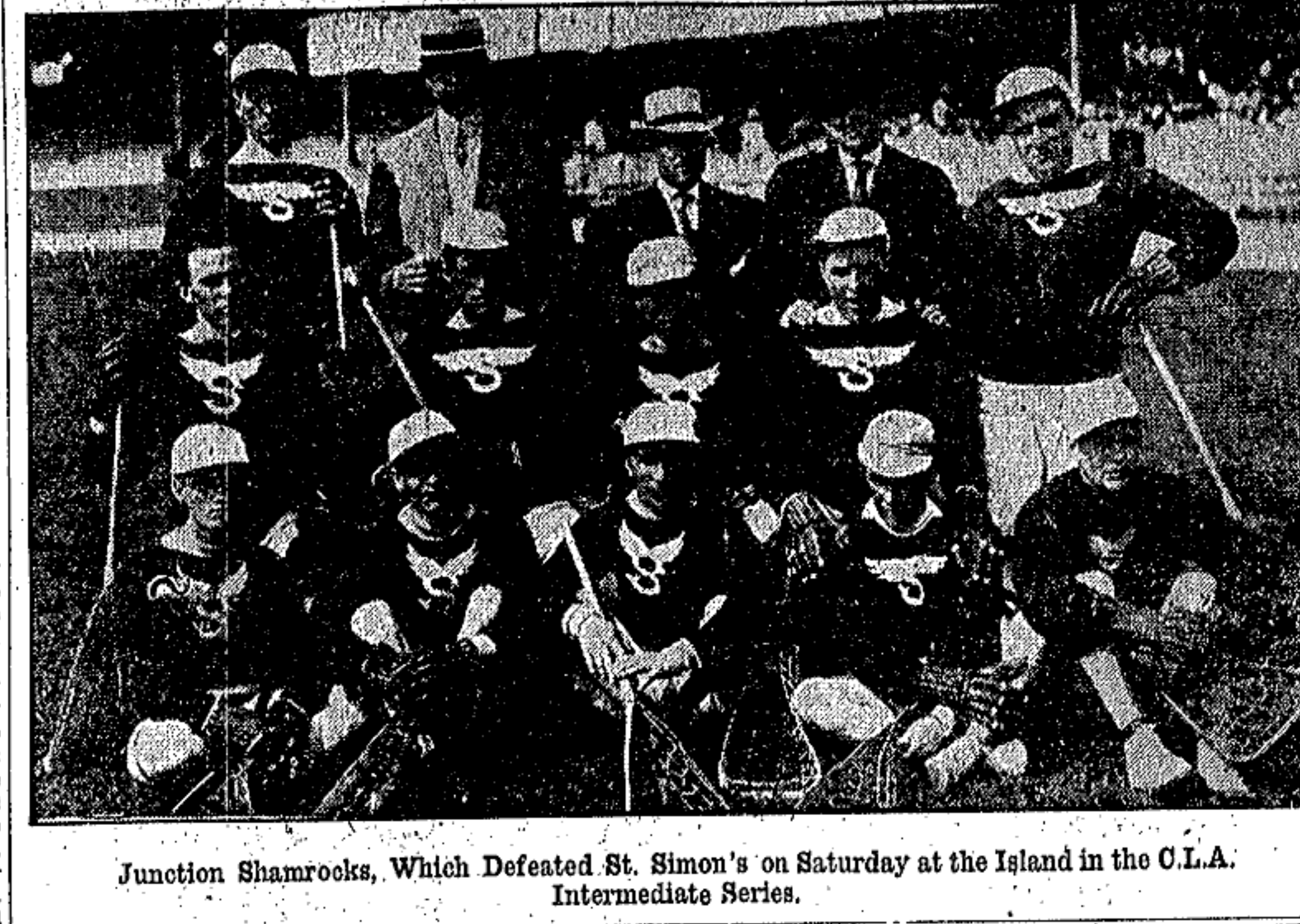
Ottawa Cyclists Form a Club—A Series of Meets Arranged.
