PEOPLE VERSUS THE ISLANDERS Aldermen Are Doubtful What Constitutes a Private Residence. IROQUOIS AVE. IS EXCITED Over a Boarding-House—The Solicitor Asked to Give His Opinion. What is a private residence? That is what the Island Committee of the City Council is trying to find out, and to assist it in solving the problem it has called four heads of departments to its assistance: The Park Commissioner, The City Solicitor, The Assessment Commissioner, The City Architect. Neighbors Object. All this fuss is over a boarding house which Mrs. Mary Lane wishes to build on Iroquois avenue at the Island. This is one of the select streets, and double prices were paid for lots on it. Residents told the committee yesterday afternoon that they had been assured before building that the street would be reserved for private residences. Their leases are that of Mrs. Lane provide that the said house shall be used for no other purpose than a private residence. Mrs. Lane wants to spend \$7,000 on a big three-story boarding house with a flat roof, and from aesthetic and other points of view her neighbors object. Nearly three stories of the building were up, in fact, when the City Architect found out what was going on last Friday. He stopped the work. Yesterday Mrs. Lane's solicitor admitted that it was wrong to go on without a permit, but pleaded that it was common practice to overlook.
