KAISER BILL DIDN'T INTEND TO BUTT IN

And the Germans Are Inclined to Be Hurt at the United States' Attitude. Special Cable to The Star.

Berlin, July 12.—The United Press representative here is authorized by the German Foreign Office to transmit the following official statement regarding yesterday's despatches from Washington to the effect that Kaiser Wilhelm was suspected there of meddling in the affairs of South and Central America.

"The Emperor is always most careful to avoid wounding the susceptibility of America in regard to Central and South American countries. Germany's purposes solely commercial aims in the western hemisphere, and does not dream of coaling stations there, Germany does not meddle in the politics of different countries."

"Kaiser Wilhelm's letter to President Madriz was the customary diplomatic acknowledgment of the Emperor's intimation that he (Madriz) had assumed the office of president. The phrase, 'great and good friend,' to which umbrage is taken, is invariably used by monarchs in writing to presidents of republics.
