### JOHNSON'S CASE POSTPONED

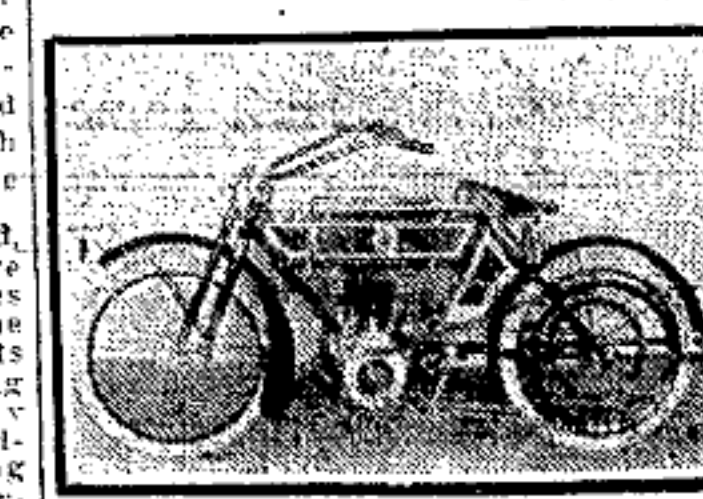

A Lively Election in Progress Over the Club Treasurership—Two Candidates.

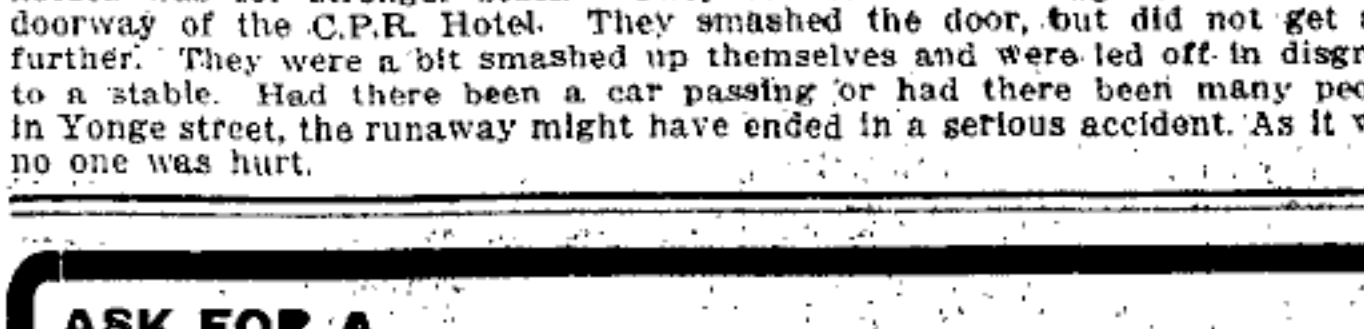
"That notice of motion to exclude Jews, negroes, and other obnoxious nationalities from the club will get the quick bounce to-night at the annual meeting," remarked Commodore Arthur Armstrong to-day. "I don't think the mover will voluntarily withdraw it. It never should have come up. The mover brought it before the board of management, and I think he will drop it. If he doesn't he will get a scolding at to-night's meeting. Why, the club has several Jewish members, and all of them have proven their loyalty. To my idea every man, be he Jew or Gentile, Italian or Canadian, must stand on his own merits. If he is a decent fellow we want him. If he isn't, we don't."
