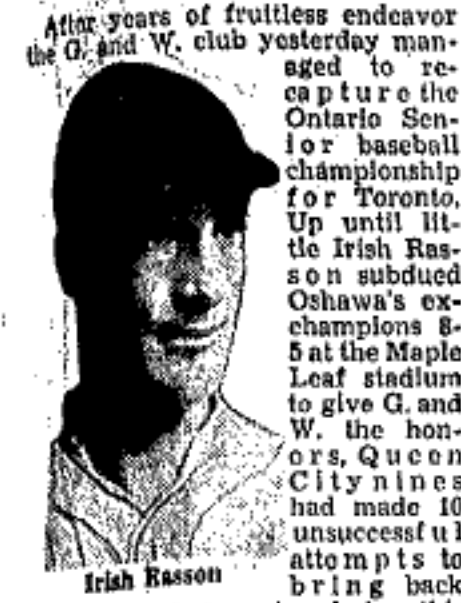

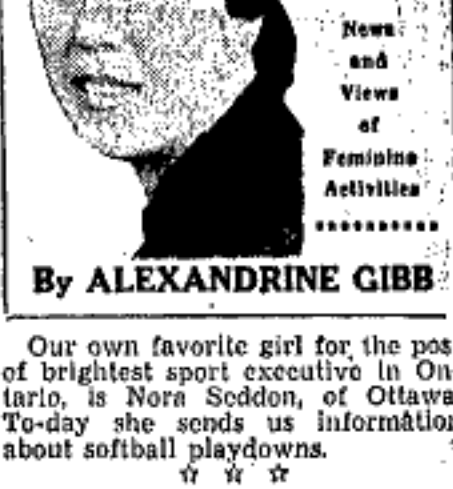

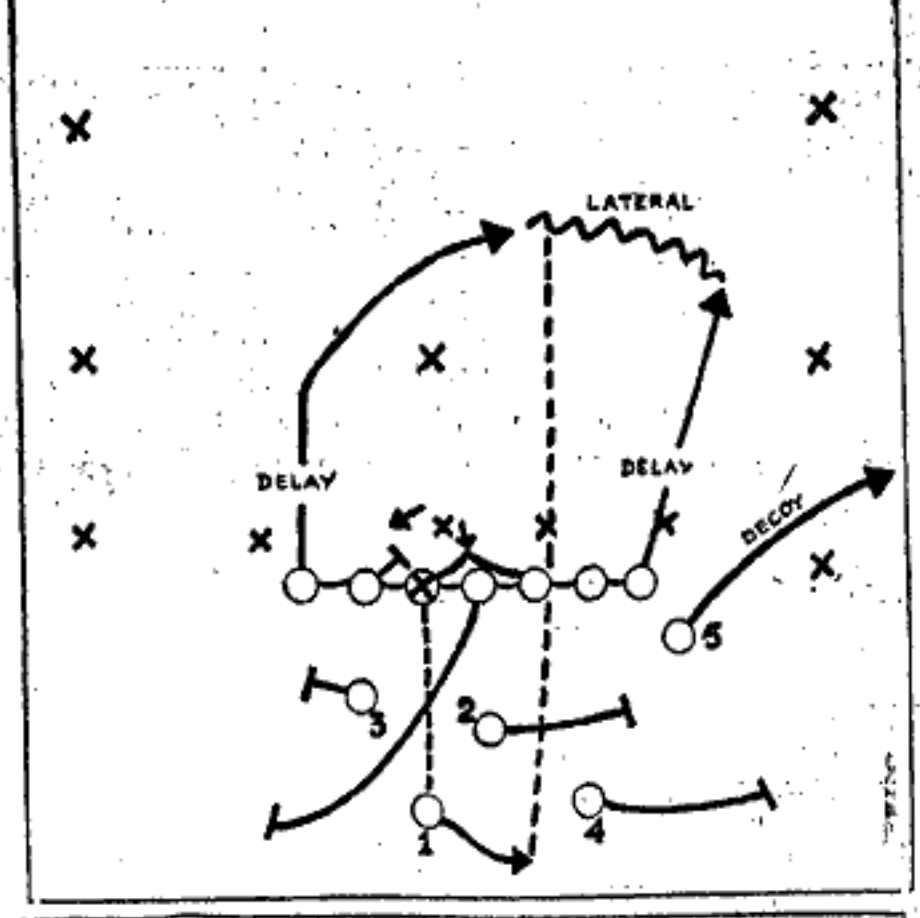

A Strong Pass Defence Can Become An Offence

A strong, well-planned and carefully developed pass defence can become a powerful offensive threat by the use of interceptions. These interceptions are not mere accidents, but are produced only after hours of planning and preparation in the ways and means of preventing passes from being completed.
