JACK SIMPSON PACES LION OIL TO 5-2 WIN

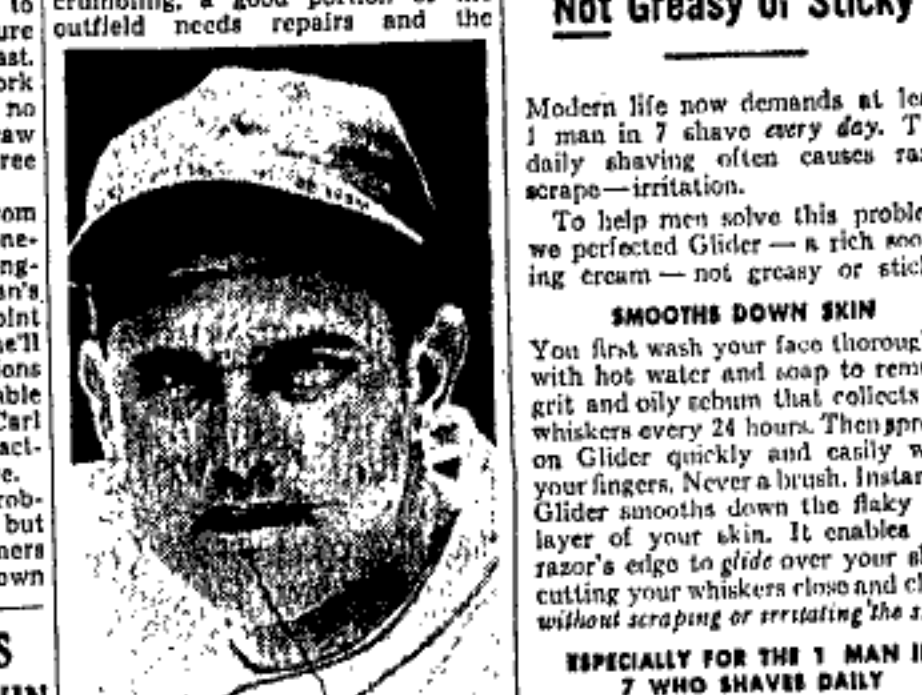
