

Champ Jockey, Gordon Richards, Injured in Spill

Brighton, England, June 9 (AP).—Champion jockey Gordon Richards cracked two ribs in a fall to-day while making a desperate bid to end a 28-race losing streak.

His mount, Austere, folded up three furlongs from the finish of a mile race. Austere was bunched with half a dozen other horses in a position to challenge the pacer-maker, Hellograph.

The 40-year-old champion, who had ridden 74 winners this season until he fell out of luck June 9, was pitched under the hooves of the field.

Two other jockeys were unseated and one horse killed in the following scramble. Richards was rushed to a hospital where an X-ray examination showed two cracked ribs. He was dismissed after treatment.

The stewards ruled the mishap an accident. Sam Wragg, who was in the scramble along with Tom Sidebottom, said he believed Austere crossed his legs. Neither Wragg nor Sidebottom was hurt.

The accident cost Richards a chance to end his losing streak, a rare run for him. He was scheduled to ride Neolanta in the last race and she won.

Richards has ridden more winners in his lifetime than any other jockey—3,544. He is far out in front this year for national honors.
