Mathews' Homers Help Braves Beat N.Y. Giants, 13-0

Milwaukee, July 27 (UP).—Eddie Mathews drove in five runs with two homers as Milwaukee Braves went on the warpath tonight, to trample New York Giants, 13-0.

Southpaw Warren Spahn scattered seven hits in hurling the shutout for the Braves. His teammates backed him up with a 14-hit assault on four Giant pitchers.

Young Mathews was the big gun in the Milwaukee attack, however, as he hit a homer with the bases loaded in the fourth inning and got another with the bases empty in the eighth. The two homers, his 31st and 32nd of the season, put him even with Babe Ruth's pace when he set the major league record of 60 home runs. Ruth and Mathews both "got their 32nd homers in their 32nd game."

Every man in the Milwaukee starting lineup, except Spahn, got at least one hit, and Mathews got three safeties.

The Braves started the scoring in the third when they picked up the first tally on Jack Dittmer's single, a sacrifice, and Johnny Logan's single to left.

The roof fell in on the Giants in the fourth when Milwaukee scored eight runs. The big blow was Mathews' grand slam homer, but the Braves already had scored four runs in the inning and three pitchers had seen action.

Williams Will Be Released By U.S. Marine Corps Today

Washington, July 27 (AP).—Ted Williams will be released from the Marine Corps tomorrow and go right to Boston to rejoin the Red Sox. However, he's a bit afraid that he might hurt the team if he gets back into the lineup too soon.

There's sound reason for Ted's alarm, whether it's genuine or not. He hasn't swung a bat in more than a year.

But, Williams said, he's eager to play ball, and as soon as possible. That could be tomorrow night when the Red Sox opens a home

stand against Chicago White Sox. Changes are, however, Williams won't be used for a while even as a pinch hitter. He isn't exactly in top playing condition.

The Marine Corps reported today Williams' formal separation from active duty will take place at the naval gun factory here. A couple of signatures on the dotted line and one of the greatest hitters in modern times will be free for active duty on the baseball diamond.

Doctors at the Naval Hospital in suburban Bethesda, Md., gave Williams a complete bill of health today after he had undergone treatment for nearly a month for an ear and nose ailment he picked up as a jet pilot in Korea.

Williams was due for deactivation until Oct. 1, but he requested an earlier separation date in view of the doctors' decision that he is fit to return to active duty.

Williams said he didn't think his ailment would affect his baseball capacities. "I guess I can't hear as well as I used to, but I don't think that'll bother my ball playing," he said.
