Epp Sparks Leaside To Win Over Goliaths; First in 12 Seasons

Leaside beat East York, 8-1, amid a steady rainfall last night at East York Stadium to register its first win over the Goliaths in 12 years of competing in the Toronto District Interscholastic Athletic Association senior football series.

Other senior scores were: Royal York 25, Port Credit 0; Winston Churchill 15, University of Toronto Schools 0; R. H. King 19, Agincourt 6; Etobicoke 25, T. L. Kennedy 0; Weston 12, Vaughan Road 7; Brampton 14, Burnhamthorpe 0; and Runnymede 39, York Memorial 13.

Veteran halfback Gord Epp sparked Leaside, kicking a pair of singles and setting up a touchdown late in the game with a 40-yard run.

In the second half, Epp outwitted East York by returning a Goliath punt and the ball went 40 yards for a tie-breaking single. Pat Powers played for the only touchdown following Epp's long run.

John Turkis and John Bennett were outstanding as defensive halfbacks while Bob Lackey led the winners line play.

Royal York, last year's B champions, had top line play in trouncing Port Credit, the western division champion in 1956.

Sub-quarterback Barry Lucas sparked Winston Churchill to its victory against University of Toronto Schools, the A finalists last season.

On the opening kickoff, Lucas booted the ball into the end zone for a point. After Jerry Brooker plunged for a touchdown which Don McLea converted, Lucas kicked a single.

Bob Hennessy intercepted a Vaughan pass in the late minutes and streaked 65 yards for a touchdown to hand Weston a victory.

Brampton, Sept. 20.—Brampton 'Excelsiors' are the new Canada junior lacrosse champions and possessors of the Minto Cup. Their 15-7 win over Victoria Shamrocks here tonight, gave them the best-of-seven series, 4-2.

Four goals in less than two minutes of the second period broke up what had been a close battle as Brampton went on to an 11-4 lead. They led, 3-1, in the first quarter and 8-4 at the half.
